

Announcement of 2013 Daniel Tsui Fellowship

The Centre of Theoretical and Computational Physics in the University of Hong Kong is pleased to announce that The 2013 Daniel Tsui Fellowship is awarded to:

Professor **Jing Zhang** from Shanxi University *for his “contributions to the fields of quantum information and cold atoms and especially for his pioneering experiments which employed lasers to induce strong spin-orbit coupling in fermionic atoms.”*

Brief Information of Daniel Tsui Fellowship in The University of Hong Kong

1. The Fellowship is to provide opportunities for outstanding young physicists within 15 years after receiving PhD in Mainland China and Taiwan or in Singapore to carry out research at the Center.
2. The Fellowship is awarded via a rigorous selection procedure. The Selection Committee consists of T. M. Rice (Chair, HKU and ETH-Zurich), William Goddard III (Caltech), Hong Guo (McGill Univ.), Terry Hwa (UCSD), Patrick Lee (MIT), Anthony J. Leggett (UIUC), Steve Louie (UC Berkeley), Matthias Troyer (ETH-Zurich), Daniel Tsui (Princeton Univ.), Frank Wilczek (MIT), and Shou-Cheng Zhang (Stanford Univ.).
3. Each Daniel Tsui Fellow is expected to carry out up to two-month research at the Centre with the honorarium of HKD 40,000/month. A return trip to Hong Kong and health insurance from The University of Hong Kong will be provided.
